What is the MERCY VESSEL?

Have you seen the ship *Atlantis*, now *MERCY VESSEL* docked at the marina? It is a 110' ship purchased by The Mercy Project of GPA Mobilization Ministries.

The ship will be refitted from its current state to hold a fully equipped clinic and pharmacy, dorms for 16 interns, cabins for 8 crew and staff, and a full galley and dining room. The ship will take evangelical teams, medical teams, and disaster relief teams to the islands of the South Caribbean.

The ministry currently aids approximately 2,000 patients each year; the Mercy Vessel will increase that number to an anticipated 15,000 patients per year.



Our own Bettye Briggs, the First Mate of Better Than, and the Secretary of the SNYC does a mercy mission each year to Haiti. Her group's biggest need is children's vitamins. The next trip is in January, 2016. If you can make a donation, please see her on "C" dock, or at any of the SNYC events!
